### 1. Accessing KIDS on iPad/Tablet

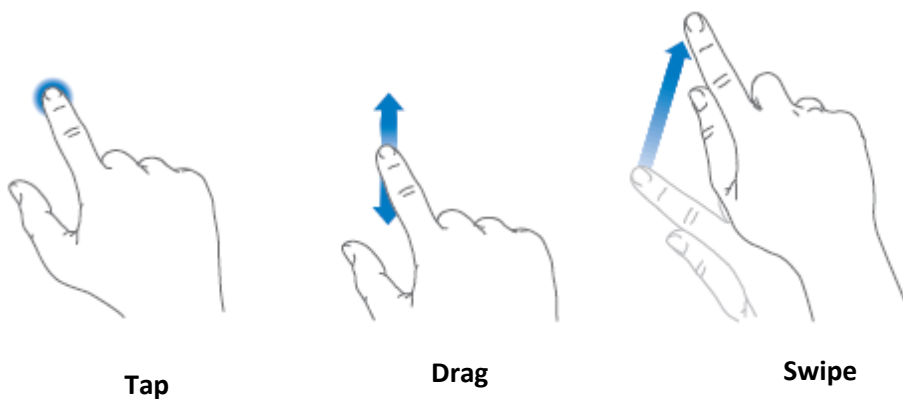
- To access KIDS on your iPad/Tablet simply go to your web browser on your iPad/Tablet and go to [www.worldbookonline.com](http://www.worldbookonline.com)
- Once logged in using your username and password, tap on the Kids icon  on the Super homepage

The interface is viewable in both portrait and landscape mode.



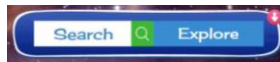
The primary motion for using the new KIDS interface on an iPad/Tablet:

#### Menu items:



Tap to search a topic. Type in a keyword for your search. Predictive search will bring up a drop box with a list of related articles to your keyword. Tap the keyword that relates to your search. Alternatively, type in your word and tap Explore to view article categories.  
Tap to view the image gallery containing a variety of pictures and videos.



Tap to enter World of Animals to compare animals side-by-side.

Tap to access all Activities including For Grownups section with Lesson Plans.

Tap to access Interactive Maps, World Book Atlas, and Outline Maps and Flags.

Tap to access puzzles, crosswords, sorting games, matching games and multiple-choice games.

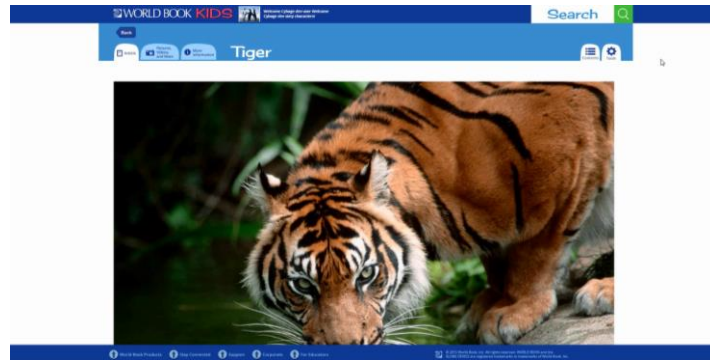
Tap to access information on important people (biographies).

Tap to compare places e.g. compare continents, countries and states.

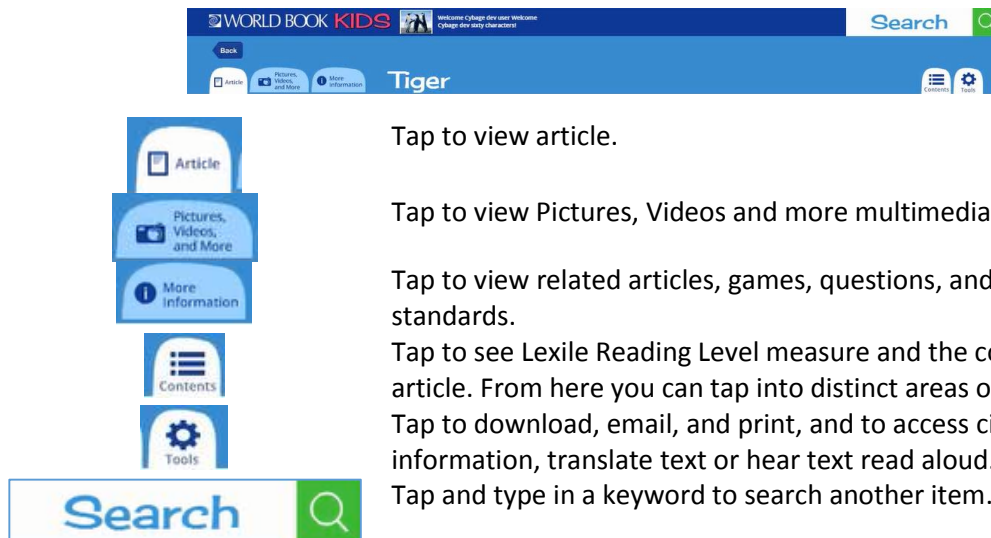
Tap to access Science Project ideas, for teachers and students.

### Menu items:



Tap to view article.

Tap to view Pictures, Videos and more multimedia.

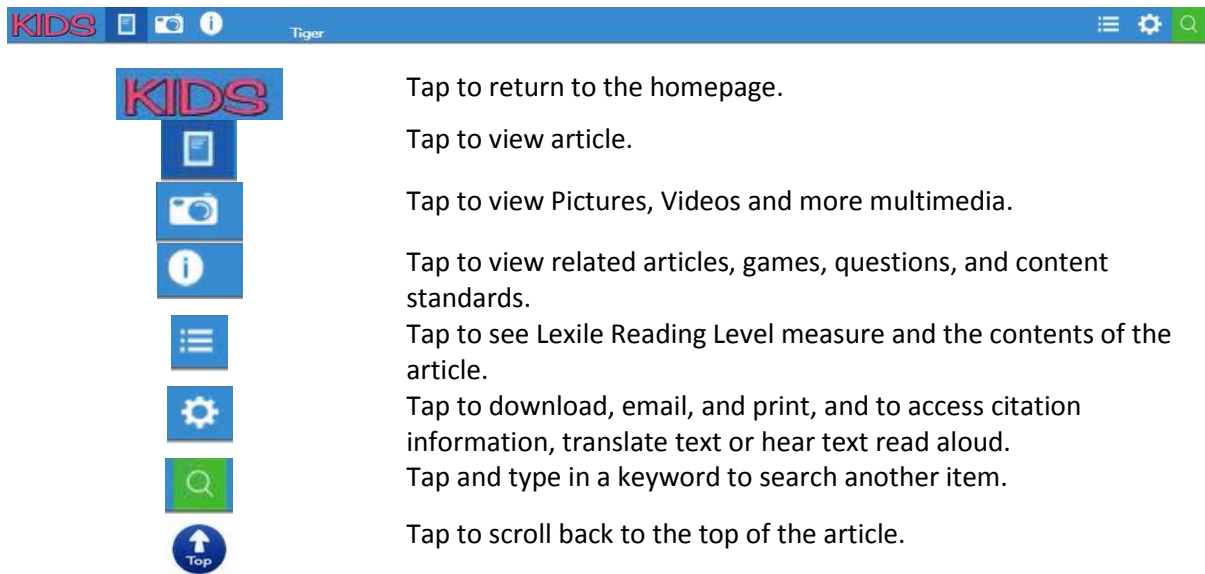
Tap to view related articles, games, questions, and content standards.

Tap to see Lexile Reading Level measure and the contents of the article. From here you can tap into distinct areas of the article.

Tap to download, email, and print, and to access citation information, translate text or hear text read aloud.

Tap and type in a keyword to search another item.

Tap to return to the homepage.

Tap to view article.

Tap to view Pictures, Videos and more multimedia.

Tap to view related articles, games, questions, and content standards.

Tap to see Lexile Reading Level measure and the contents of the article.

Tap to download, email, and print, and to access citation information, translate text or hear text read aloud.

Tap and type in a keyword to search another item.

Tap to scroll back to the top of the article.
